The renewed focus on the spiritually rooted ministry of the Ramallah Friends Meeting and its' service to the Palestinian community finds a voice in the Sunday Meetings for Worship where a slowly and surely growing number of attenders – some traveling for two and three hours – come to share prayer and song, ministry and discussion, fellowship and bread – all in preparation for their work in the week ahead.

Earlier in the year, there were many programs and gatherings. During and after the war on Gaza, the wider Palestinian community was focused on attending to the needs of the people of Gaza, and many conditions made it nearly impossible to resume activities that had earlier
