Dear Friend,

What an exciting and fruitful time it has been for Ramallah Friends Meeting (RFM) over the past six months and what a fulfilling time for those of us who seek to accompany them in the witness being made! As I share the highlights with you, I hope you can share in the deep sense of fulfillment – because it is your prayers and your generous financial support that have made the continuing Spirit-filled work possible. Your oil has fed the continuing flame of hope in Ramallah and they, in turn, provide oil for our lamps, helping us to remain steadfast in our commitment to accompany them in their struggle for peace and justice.

Over the past few years we have spoken to you of RFM and Friends of Ramallah Friends Meeting (FRFMQ) being in transition – from the original model, Friends International Center in Ramallah, established in 2006, in which there was a full time Program Coordinator - a position filled by an international - to our current model which is based on strengthening the sustainability of RFM, having a Palestinian staff partnering with Jean Zaru, the Presiding Clerk, and having a strengthened Worshiping Community that brings vitality to the meeting not only at Sunday worship, but during the week as well.

This past February the time seemed right for two members of the Steering Committee, Marla Schrader and myself, to spend ten days in Ramallah supporting the Meeting as it took the next significant steps toward sustainability. It was a

wonderfully energizing time in which we experienced firsthand the recent resumption of mid-week worship in the home of one of the Worshiping Community with a shared meal following worship. Regular participants in that community include a couple with two young sons, as well as several volunteers from North West Yearly Meeting (NWYM) who assist at the Friends School and also have an English tutoring program for adults.

There were three visiting delegations during the time of our visit, academics, pastors and theologians from Africa, Asia and Europe who came for the specific opportunity to hear the thoughts of Jean Zaru and to dialogue with her about her book, Occupied by Nonviolence. It was wonderful, in hearing those exchanges, to imagine the seeding of each participant's further reflections on nonviolence and their having experienced Jean's witness of hope as they returned to their homes and their work.

We chose the specific time of our visit knowing that Eden Grace, Director of Global Ministries of Friends United Meeting (FUM), and her counterpart in NWYM, Shawn McConaughey, would be there. We had extended meetings with them separately and together so that our understanding of their ministries in Ramallah could be more fully understood, so that Jean could report on the ministries of the Meeting, so that we could explore what common ground we had and to think together if there are ways in which we can collaborate. Our conversations were candid and fruitful.

Finally, we went on our trip with the intention of supporting Jean in the interviewing of six candidates and the selection of one to fill a newly established position designed to strengthen the communication capacities of the Meeting – its Website and Facebook page and its capacity to make more accessible her message on nonviolence. This new employee of the Meeting will also take over some of the basic management relating to scheduling and oversight of the meetinghouse.
